The grain prices has been a common conversation, unfortunately all the grain still in the system from the last several years of good crops is not helping the situation. Driving through western Kansas and seeing all the piles that continue to be present, some of which have not even been touched in last several months, confirms this situation. Our goal every year is to make every attempt to have our facilities empty prior to fall harvest.

The Ottawa Coop is always looking to add new services for our customers. The past couple years there has been an increased focus on adding services in the precision ag landscape with the addition of crop scouting, soil sampling, and additional labor and equipment to support variable rate farming practices. Joe Redman heads up our agronomy sales force that we've added over the past couple years with representation spread across our trade territory which I'm sure a lot of you have been in contact with. This sales force consists of some long term employees along with the addition of some new faces. Brian Green heading up our crop scouting business has recently added a drone to his services and got the certifications necessary to operate this new asset, we're excited about the possibilities this will open up going forward. We added a second variable rate fertilizer applicator for this spring as well as a second seed tender with the addition of our new bulk seed plant located at Burlingame South, a location which was purchased a year ago just outside of Burlingame. We are currently working on expanding the capabilities and services offered from our Feed Department located in Waverly Kansas.

The boards of Ottawa Coop and AgMark LLC are pleased to announce the approval of Ottawa Coop as a new owner and grain marketing member of AgMark LLC. AgMark LLC is currently owned by Farmway Co-op Inc, Cloud County Co-op Elevator Association, Concordia Terminal LLC, Randall Farmers Co-op Union, ProAg Marketing, and Central Valley Ag. Under the agreed terms, Ottawa Coop will contribute its grain marketing, grain logistics and grain accounting to AgMark LLC. The strategic arrangement between AgMark and Ottawa Coop will increase grain movement and marketing efficiencies for all organizations. Producer meetings are currently being scheduled and the invites will be coming through the mail in the near future, please plan on attending one of the meetings to get a better understanding of this new partnership.

Last month there was a flyer inserted in regards to two employee retirements. There will be about 2-3 retirements happening every year for the next 4-5 years. Additional employees brought in over the past couple years have been in preparation for this transition, this plan is progressing nicely. New faces will continue to show up across all locations. The Ottawa Coop is fortunate to have an excellent staff to help with all areas of your farming operation.

The 2017 growing season is right around the corner and we have had perfect weather so far to get much needed tasks done in preparation. VRT

GRAIN REVIEW BY: MATTHEW VAJNAR, GRAIN MERCHANDISER

February has come and come gone, but not before providing the grain markets with 2 related inputs that can have effect this summer.

The preliminary price for potential new crop insurance payments is calculated in February. Those prices are \$10.19 (versus \$8.85 in 2016) for soybeans and \$3.96 (\$3.86 YA) for corn. The USDA February

Outlook was held Feb 24-25 and estimated 2017 corn acres at 90 million (off 4 million from 2016) and soybeans at 88 million (up \sim 4 $\frac{1}{2}$ million).

This is a potentially favorable price scenario for farmers because corn acreage impacts supply more than yield. This reduction of 4 million corn acres has to be offset by roughly a $7 \frac{1}{2}$ bpa increase nationally to keep

production equivalent to last year. Soybean supply, on the other hand, is more influenced by yield. A one bushel decrease in soybean yield requires roughly 1.7 million more acres to equalize production. This dynamic is not lost on fund traders who will be quick to jump in on the long side of the markets at the hint of weather adversity this summer.

We cannot stress enough going into planting season starting clean with overlapping residuals to help get you the most out of your crop. We will have a couple new herbicides Xtendimax and Engenia this year as another tool in eliminating those pesky weeds. With that said it also is going to be a learning curve for everyone with these products as we all want to make sure we are good stewards going forward with these products.
